What is Jane's Walk?

Jane's Walk is a global movement of free, citizen-led walking tours inspired by legendary urbanist Jane Jacobs. The annual festival takes place on the first weekend in

Who is Jane?

Jane Jacobs (1916-2006) was an American/Canadian journalist, author and activist who championed new, community-based approaches to planning for over 40 years. Her 1961 treatise, The Death and Life of Great American Cities, became perhaps the most influential [North] American text about the inner workings and failings of cities, inspiring generations of urban planners and activists. She lived in Greenwich Village, New York City and then in the Annex district, Toronto.

About Burritt's Rapids

Located about 40 minutes from the Parliament Buildings, Burritt's Rapids is officially part of the City of Ottawa. Living in Burritt's offers a life with one foot in the city and one in the country. Living beside the Rideau River and Rideau Canal, surrounded by forests and fields, it's like year-round cottage living. The village was founded in 1793 by United Empire Loyalists and is one of 26 villages in the rural city, brought into the fold during amalgamation in 2001. Historically, Burritt's has always been split between two townships – north of the river lies Ottawa, south of the river is North Grenville. This unusual dual-government arrangement creates a few, shall we say, anomalies, which we all master sooner or later. For residents, it's a single community with quirks.
